BURSARY OPPORTUNITIES FOR EDAC-ATAC MEMBERS

EDUCATION/PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT BURSARY

EDAC-ATAC will award <u>one</u> bursary of \$500 to cover the costs of education or professional development in eating disorders. The goal of this bursary is to support an individual to develop further knowledge or skills in the field of eating disorders, and to extend this knowledge to benefit others in their professional or community setting.

This bursary can be used towards educational or training events (e.g., workshops, conference fees), and/or educational materials (e.g., books or manuals).

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be a current EDAC-ATAC member (or submit a completed membership application at the time of the application for the bursary).
- Applicants must be either (1) working or training in a clinical setting relevant to eating disorders or (2) connected to a relevant community organization that provides support for individuals with eating disorders.

Application Deadline:

• The deadline for submission of application materials is June 30, 2021.

Application Materials:

- **Application Statement:** Please submit one page or less in which you provide: details of your interests and work/involvement in the field of eating disorders, a description of the plan for use of the funds towards education or professional development, and how the applicant will share the knowledge/skills gained with others in their work setting or community.
- **Curriculum Vitae:** Please include a curriculum vitae that includes details about academic training, employment history, other relevant professional activities (e.g., teaching or research), community activities, and details of publications or other knowledge translation activities.

Conditions of the Award

• The recipient of the award will be asked to submit a statement to EDAC by December 31, 2021 about how the funds were used, and to prepare a brief (200 word) summary about their educational/professional development experience for publication in the EDAC-ATAC newsletter.

RESEARCH BURSARY

EDAC-ATAC will award <u>one</u> bursary of \$500 to support the costs of a research project relevant to eating disorders. The goal of this bursary is to stimulate research in the field of eating disorders.

This bursary can be used towards research materials, education/training relevant to a research project (e.g., workshops) and/or to defray the cost of conference fees or fees associated with the presentation of research results.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be a current EDAC-ATAC member (or submit a completed membership application at the time of the application for the bursary).
- Applicants must be affiliated with an institution (e.g., university or hospital) that provides oversight and regulation of research activities (e.g., Research Ethics Board).
- Preference will be given to students/trainees and early career investigators (less than 5 years since obtaining their degree).

Application Deadline:

• The deadline for submission of application materials is June 30, 2021.

Application Materials:

- **Research Statement:** Please submit one page or less in which you provide: details of the purpose and methodology of the proposed study, the clinical implications of the proposed project, a description of the plan for use of the funds towards research expenses, and knowledge translation plans. Please also include confirmation that approval from the relevant ethics committee at the applicant's institution will be sought or has been obtained. One additional page can be included in the application to list references/citations or other materials for the appendix (e.g., tables/figures).
- **Curriculum Vitae:** Please include a curriculum vitae that includes details about academic training, employment history, other relevant professional activities (e.g., teaching or research), community activities, and details of publications or other knowledge translation activities.

Conditions of the Award

• The recipient of the award will be asked to submit a statement to EDAC by December 31, 2021 about how the funds were used, and to prepare a brief (200 word) summary about their project for publication in the EDAC-ATAC newsletter.
